

Exploring the process - Step 2: Working structure

A successful UNP needs a clear, organised approach. Establishing a strong working structure - such as a task force or steering committee - is key to moving the plan forward. With dedicated project coordinators and interdepartmental teams, local governments can ensure effective implementation and coordination.

Key actions:

- ✓ Establish a dedicated urban nature team.
- ✓ Define roles, responsibilities and authorities.
- ✓ Integrate nature-related objectives into all urban planning decisions.
