

Exploring the process - Step 7: Priorities, actions, responsibilities, timelines and financing

This step translates the vision into concrete actions. Clear priorities and timetables, together with assigned responsibilities, ensure that everyone knows what to do and when. It's also important to identify financial resources, from local budgets to national and EU funding, to support implementation. It also fulfils Milestone 4: Action Plan, which outlines the detailed approach to achieving the city's urban nature goals.

Key actions:

- ✓ Define and prioritise actions to achieve urban nature goals.
- Assign roles and responsibilities to individuals or organisations.
- Identify funding sources and ensure sustainability.
